## How learning outside the classroom could benefit you

It can be a struggle to find time to attend courses as part of your CPD. This is why learning outside the classroom plays such an important role in supporting professional development. It often doesn't take up as much time as more formal learning and can be adapted around you and your schedule.

Make sure you record your learning and that it's acknowledged when talking about the steps you take to support your personal and professional development. These activities are an important and valid part of your learning as you prepare for your personal development review, a promotion or a lateral job application or interview.

An informal de-brief after an incident with a more experienced colleague or considering what you took from the latest edition of [Going equipped](#) are both just as effective as a course in supporting your development.

As everyone in policing faces ever more complex challenges, keeping up to date with your learning and development is more important than ever. Recognising informal learning outside of the classroom is important too.

## Learning from social media

- Hosted by Inspector Caroline Hay and Sergeant Owen Messenger

For most of us social media has become part of our daily routine. We use it to connect with our friends and family but also as a space to learn from each other. In this webinar, we will hear from two police officers with very different social media experiences.

Inspector Caroline Hay from City of London Police will speak about [#WeCops](#), a fortnightly 'tweetchat' that offers a forum to develop and share knowledge, ideas, best practice and evidence-based research. Caroline will discuss her learning journey through #WeCops, highlighting some of the most successful sessions so far and suggesting ways you can use social media for your own CPD.

Sergeant Owen Messenger from Devon and Cornwall Police has been working with a local YouTuber to create videos to engage with young drivers and the modified car community – vulnerable road users who are traditionally hard for the police to reach.

To date the project has attracted 380,000 followers on TikTok, 37,000 subscribers on YouTube and 35,000 followers on Instagram, while a video released recently achieved 1.7 million views in less than 24 hours.
